ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN (ESCP)

1. The Dominican Republic (hereinafter, the **Recipient**) will cause the National Migration Institute (INM) to implement the "SPF: Dominican Republic Multisectoral Response to Human Mobility" (the **Project**), with the participation of the Ministry of Economy, Planning and Development (MEPYD, in its Spanish acronym) and with the collaboration of the General Directorate of Migration (DGM, in its Spanish acronym), the National Statistics Office (ONE, in its Spanish acronym), the Ministry of Women (MM, Spanish acronym), the Directorate of Strategy and Government Communication (DIECOM, in its Spanish acronym), the Spanish acronym), the Single System of Beneficiaries (SIUBEN, in its Spanish acronym), and the Supérate Program, as Participating Institutions, as mentioned in the Grant Agreement. The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (hereinafter, the **Bank**) has agreed to provide financing for the Project, as set out in the referred agreement.

2. The Recipient shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESS) and this Environmental and Social Engagement Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the Bank. The ESCP is part of the Grant Agreement. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the referred agreement.

3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the Recipient shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, the timeframes of the actions and measures, institutional, staffing, training, monitoring, and reporting arrangements, and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) instruments that shall be adopted and implemented under the Project, all of which shall be subject to prior consultation and disclosure, consistent with the ESS, and in form and substance, and in a manner acceptable to the Bank. Once adopted, said E&S instruments may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement by the Bank.

4. As agreed between the Bank and the Recipient, this ESCP will be revised from time to time if necessary, during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the Recipient and the Bank, agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the Bank and the Recipient, through the Minister, of the Ministry of Economy, Planning and Development. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
